Goalkeeper: Phil Joslin, one of the best and most consistent keepers in the Second Division. A Devonian, he joined the City in the summer of 1948 from Torquay United, with whom he had been for twelve seasons.

Right Back: Glyn Williams, as his name truly indicates, is a native of Wales, moving to Cardiff in 1947 from Caerau. One of the City's several versatile players, he has appeared in all the middle line positions, and is equally adept at right back. Played for Wales at Wrexham yesterday.

Left Back: Alf Sherwood, who has represented Wales in many games. He joined Cardiff from Aberdare during the war years, and he is now playing as well as ever.

Right Half: Ken Hollyman, whose brilliant contributions in previous matches are readily recalled. He is just as at home at outside right, but his wholehearted, tireless work is of greatest value to the side at right half.

Centre Half: Stan Montgomery, who was playing at wing half-back for Southend United when Cardiff signed him during the 1948-49 season. Has developed into a resolute and efficient pivot. Stan is an able cricketer, playing for Glamorgan in the County Championship.

Left Half: Bill Baker, the oldest serving member of the team, being with the City before the war. A grand constructive player, he also has represented Wales.

Outside Right: Michael Tiddy, a fast raiding Cornishman from the Lizard. He left for South Wales a few months ago and immediately made a hit with the City.

Inside Right: Bobbie McLaughlin, Cardiff City's close season capture from Wrexham. Has played many Second Division games this season and is at his best in greasy going.

Centre Forward: Wilfred Grant, the ex-Southampton player, who has been converted from a right wing forward to an effective leader.

inside Left: Douglas Blair, the former Blackpool forward. One of the best ball players in the Second Division. His skilful use of the ball is a feature of his play.

Outside Left: George Edwards, schoolmaster-footballer, who is clever and effective. Formerly with Birmingham City, he has given some excellent displays of the quality expected of a Welsh International.
